1. Gotham District Attorney

- a. Name: Richad Hirani
- b. Bio: At 28 years old, Richad Hirani was the youngest person to ever be appointed as the Defence Attorney of Gotham. Although he has only been in the position for three months, he's becoming known as the "Lion" of Gotham – doing what is right not because it is easy, but because it is needed. Although he has made some progress in reducing crime in Gotham, crime remains very high, especially in the poorer neighbourhoods of Gotham. Due to their work prosecuting criminals in Gotham, both he and his friend Police Commissioner Robert Gordon have numerous death threats to their name. As such, Hirani has avoided seeking out a family in the hope of keeping them out of danger. Hirani graduated from Gotham University and has lived in Gotham for his entire life. When asked what he's like, answers vary depending on who is asked – while someone in the police force might argue that he has the "vision of Martin Luther King", a criminal in jail might describe him as "being as ruthless as Vladimir Putin".

2. CEO of GothCorp

- a. Name: Robert Hannah
- b. Bio: To anyone that really knows him, the fact that Robert Hannah was nominated for Gotham's "Humanitarian Industrialist of the Year" award is laughable. Perhaps a better award would've been Gotham's "Most Ruthless Businessman of the Year". Hannah is the kind of CEO that knows what he wants and will do whatever it take to get what he needs. While he has some ties in the Gotham underworld, Hannah strives to maintain his "Mr. Humanitarian" façade in the eyes of the public and thereby contributes heavily to charities and other good causes. Among the many causes he donates to is the National Foundation for Octopuses, which he donates to in remembrance of his pet Octopus, Jimmy, who was accidentally misplaced by an assistant into a tank of acid instead of a tank of water. Silly assistant. Octopuses can't live in acid.

3. CEO of Ace Chemicals

- a. Name: Phil Kehoe
- b. Bio: Kehoe is like one of those people that comes into college as a human rights major and leaves working for an investment bank. He left Gotham University as an environmental studies major and worked for the UNEP for a while before he was approached by Shady McShaderson, the head lobbyist at Ace Chemicals. After some "convincing", Kehoe realized that he could triple his salary by working for the environmental "bad guys" and started working as a lobbyist for Ace Chemicals. Over the next 15 years, Kehoe worked in various departments of the company until its CEO "mysteriously" passed away and Kehoe was selected as her replacement. While Kehoe has only been in the position for two months, it seems that he's doing a good job running the company (but it's unclear as to what he's doing behind the scenes). Ace Chemicals is a company that produces primarily cleaning chemicals and has been around for approximately 30 years. Kehoe keeps a pet Otter named Atif in order to remind him to always keep a balance between his nefarious and good actions, just as an otter keeps the delicate balance within its environment.

4. Researcher at Wayne Enterprises

- a. Name: Andrew Latham
- b. Bio: Andrew Latham was born in Gotham in 1988 to a factory worker and a stay at home mother. He lived his early life in poverty, making and selling small gadgets on the black market in order to have enough money to buy food. In 2010, he received a full scholarship to Gotham University to study Computer Science and Machine Learning, where he eventually graduated (early) in 2013 with full honours. Immediately after graduation, Wayne Enterprises hired him for their Research & Development program where he currently works as a researcher, designing electrical boards for a few of their projects. When he's not working, one can find him in his garage, tinkering away on personal projects. No one really knows what he's working on, but we're interested.

5. Warden at Blackgate Penitentiary

- a. Name: Anna Marks
- b. Bio: As her linguistics professor once described her, Marks has “an uncanny ability to pick up languages”. Ever since she was a child, Marks’ biggest passion was communication. She was able to speak fluent English by the time she was three years old, and learnt Spanish, French, Chinese, Russian, and Hindi by the time she turned 18. Upon graduating from Gotham University in Linguistics, Marks had a hard time finding a job – the economy had fallen into a recession and no one seemed to want to hire a Linguistics major. Thankfully for her, she eventually found employment in Blackgate Penitentiary, the second largest prison in all of Gotham (second, of course, to Arkham Asylum). She currently serves as a prison guard (along with her pet honey badger, Isabelle), and uses her special language skills to communicate with all of the different prisoners that are sent to Blackgate. Known for her no-bullshit attitude, Marks hopes to one day leave Blackgate, and hopes to someday run a communications company.

6. Member of Falcone Mob

- a. Name: Jorge Lopez
- b. Bio: Jorge “Jackal” Lopez wasn’t always in the mob. I’d tell you to ask his family about the story, but Lopez was forced to kill them in order to prove his loyalty to the Falcones. The Falcones, run by Carmine Falcone, is one of Gotham’s oldest crime families, dating back to 1860 when Jeremy Falcone began the operation by opening a pizza joint called “Definitely not a front Inc.” While the pizza place didn’t last long, the family did and has since grown to being one of the largest crime families in Gotham, controlling approximately 1/4th of the gang territory in the city. Although he isn’t a huge player in the mob, Lopez has become known for being the mob’s sneakiest member (and has thus been nicknamed “Jackal” by Carmine Falcone himself), carrying out robberies throughout the city. Little is known about who he is and where he comes from, but one can occasionally catch a glint of light reflecting off of his slicked-back hair as he darts between alleys on his night-time missions.

7. Member of Thorne Mob

- a. Name: Byron Hazzard
- b. Bio: Byron Hazzard is one of the many born-and-bred criminals in Gotham. As the nephew of prominent mob boss Ruther Thorne, Hazzard knew how to shoot a gun by the time he was 8, knew how to properly dispose of a body before he was 12, and killed his first man before he was a student at Gotham High School. While school wasn't for him (he was expelled in his junior year of high school for stabbing another student with a pencil), Hazzard quickly found employment in a not-so-lucrative field: pizza delivery. Unfortunately, he soon realized that living in Gotham was too expensive for a pizza delivery guy, and he decided to give his uncle a call. A couple of "interviews" later, he was in. Today, although he's relatively young at just 22 years old, he's seen as one of the up-and-coming members within the Thorne family, and is sent almost exclusively on assassination missions. Despite his constant attempts to be internally known as "the Hazzard", his friends call him "the Hawk", as he loves to swoop down on his "unknowing, defenceless enemies"

8. Partner at Harriton Law

- a. Name: Stephanie Herrmann
- b. Bio: Stephanie is a current partner at Harriton Law, one of the largest law firms in all of Gotham. While she currently lives a high-profile lifestyle (driving expensive cars, buying expensive clothing, having a personal chef that only cooks upscale Chinese food), she wasn't always that way. Daughter of two public school teachers, she was brought up in Bludhaven and has been forced to deal with the harsh realities of life since she was a little girl. Interestingly, while many of her classmates succumbed to the violence of her neighbourhood, she became known as "Manatee Girl" – posting encouraging Manatee images all over town and offering free hugs to anyone that she felt needed it. Unfortunately for Stephanie, this wasn't an effective way to spark change: people would rob her every time she came in for a hug and would graffiti gang signs all over her positive posters. She soon realized that the best way for her to change Gotham into the city she wanted it to be was through law, and went on to graduate from Gotham University with a degree in Law. She went to China to work for many years (as there were no jobs for her in Gotham), but the moment Harrinton & Co. called her, she booked a plane and came straight back to Gotham. Today, she (to her dismay) primarily deals with CCCs (Corporation Conflict Cases), but she hopes to expand to dealing with the CCs (Criminal Cases) of Gotham so that she can make an "actual difference" in the city.

9. Member of the Chinese Triad

- a. Name: Kyle Scott
- b. Bio: Kyle Scott has been through the ringer. A Vietnam War veteran who came to Gotham after the war, Scott has been fighting for his life for as long as he can remember. When he arrived in Gotham in 1975, his ability to speak fluent Mandarin helped him join the Chinese Triads, who were happy to bring in someone who knew how to fight. They trained him of their ways, and soon enough he was one of them. A few years after joining the triads, Scott married a lovely woman named Anna and had two children, Scott Jr. and Anna Jr. After having children, Scott began cutting back his involvement in the triad and found a job as a mechanic in order to support his family. Today, Scott owns a small mechanic shop in the south of Gotham and is a senior member of the Triads in Gotham, providing advice and aid whenever he is really needed. He is known within the triads as the "old Fox" and is respected for his wartime expertise.

10. Head Toymaker at Krank Co.

- a. Name: Ari Sinani
- b. Bio: Once upon a time, there was an old toymaker named Geppetto. He created a small wooden puppet that dreamed of being a real live boy. This has very little to do with the story of Ari Sinani. But it is relevant. When he was seven years old, he was watching the aforementioned story of "Pinocchio" (if you didn't get that by now, shame on you) when a robber came in and kidnapped him from his family. He was raised in a working camp outside of Gotham building ammunition for various mob groups. When he was 18 years old, he and two of his friends planned an escape attempt from the working camp. Only he survived. Upon re-entering Gotham, he realized that he had no real employable skills: he couldn't read, he wasn't familiar with all of the new technology, and his math skills ended at arithmetic. The only skill that he knew he had was building. So he decided to "use her powers for good" (he was a superhero fanatic) and to spend his life building toys for children. Today, 15 years later, Ari continues to build toys, but not always with the same good intent. Some of Krank Co.'s toys have been used as weapons, to smuggle drugs, and to hide money. Who knows what Sinani is up to now.

11. Manager of Gotham General

- a. When you think "Manager of a hospital", what comes to mind? Someone kind and nice to children? Someone who really wants to further the world of medicine? Doctor House? Julien Brinson is none of those things. Brinson, or "the man with the dragon tattoo" (as he's known by hospital staff) is in medicine for one thing and one thing only: the money. Born to one of Gotham's wealthier families (the Brinsons, obviously), Julien always knew he wanted to do one thing: make lots and lots of money. He graduated from high school at 16 and immediately went into the 7 year medical program at Gotham University. Upon graduating, he did his residency at Gotham General, where he quickly rose up the ranks until he was managing the entire hospital. Today, Julien enjoys a relatively comfortable life, working only on weekdays and spending weekends relaxing with his girlfriend(s) in his penthouse in eastern Gotham.

12. Owner of Iceberg Lounge

- a. Name: Harrison Baker
- b. Bio: "It's an investment", Baker told his wife. "It'll be a good idea, I promise". And it was. When he was 29 years old, Harrison Baker took all of the money that he and his wife had saved over the previous 10 years and purchased the Iceberg Lounge. Over the next 10 years, he used his business expertise to rebuild the Lounge from the ground up, changing it from a decrepit fly-infested shithole into a lavish, upscale, bottle-service only club. Today, the Iceberg Lounge is one of the most exclusive clubs in all of Gotham, catering to high-profile celebrities, mob members, and government employees. The Lounge has its motto prominently displayed on the front door "What happens in the Lounge.... stays in the Lounge". It's not a very innovative motto. Okay, fine. They stole it from Las Vegas. Are you happy? Jesus.

13. Head of Gotham Utilities Department

- a. Name: Apratim Vidyarthi
- b. Bio: Apratim Vidyarthi is one of the few people on this cabinet/committee/whatever you want to call it that wasn't born and raised in Gotham. Born in Delhi, Apratim knew from a very young age that he had one passion and one passion only: Nuclear Physics. Born around 1970, Vidyarthi was raised during the Cold War Era, and thus found the idea of harnessing the energy from nuclear reactions absolutely, mind-bogglingly fascinating. He graduated with a B.S. in Nuclear Engineering from Jawaharlal Nehru University, but his time there caused him to build up a strong hatred of India and all things Indian. As such, upon graduating, he took the first chance he could get to leave the country and moved to Gotham, where he was hired into the Department of Utilities. Today, as the Department's head, Apratim oversees Gotham's energy acquisition, from its coal plants and solar fields to its nuclear facilities. He reports directly to the mayor, and has spent the last 4 years trying to improve Gotham's energy infrastructure.

14. Expert Thief

- a. Name: Simone Leeper
- b. Bio: From the day she could say "America", Simone Leeper wanted to be the President of the United States. In her fourth grade class, she campaigned with giant posters that said "Take a LEEP of faith and vote for Simone Leeper for your fourth grade class President!". In ninth grade, she hand-made buttons that said "Vote 4 Leeper" and passed them out to all 1,100 students in her high school. In her second year in college, she had planes fly across Gotham University's quad with banners that said "LEEPER IS THE BEST VOTE FOR HER OR YOU'RE AN IDIOT". She was someone who knew what she wanted, but in her senior year of college, her whole world came crashing down when her mother sent her just one document: her birth certificate. She was born in Canada. This changed everything – it meant that she couldn't run for President because she wasn't born in the United States. It meant that everything she had worked for over the last 22 years was for nothing. And this changed her. From that day on, Leeper vowed to spend her life taking from the country that took everything from her. She quit college before graduating and joined Gotham's Thieves Guild. Today, Leeper is one of the best thieves in Gotham, and she's occasionally called in by rival mobs for targeted strikes. In her own words, "If you can't join them, steal from them."

15. Archbishop of Gotham

- a. Name: Renzo Werner
- b. Bio: Renzo Werner wasn't always a religious man. Since his mother died giving birth to him, and his father was a raging alcoholic, Werner spent most of his childhood living under the assertion that God could not exist. How could a God let a child be brought up in that way? Werner pledged to himself that he would spend his life trying to improve the lives of others, and chose to join the Peace Corps and shipped off to the Congo. There, he spent his days providing medical care to those who required it and his nights trafficking drugs to make some extra money. One night, a shipment went wrong – he heard the banging at his door, the yelling from the cartel members outside his home. The last thing he saw was a masked man's shovel descending upon his head. Darkness. He awoke in the jungle, and a strange creature looked him in the eyes – an 800-pound, heavy breathing silverback gorilla. Werner stared into the eyes of the creature and, as if there were some divine connection between the two, the gorilla seemed to understand his pain. Werner held out his bound hands to the gorilla and the gorilla bit the rope in two. Now a free man, Werner ran for the nearest town, where he got on the next plane out of the country. 16. Detective in Gotham Narcotics Division

- a. Name: Alexi Bennek
- b. Bio: Alexi Bennek did a **lot** of drugs. And I mean a lot. He used to be the kind of guy whose face you would see on those pamphlets in the hospital. You know, the kind of pamphlets that say "Do Meth and you could look like **THIS**"? Yeah. Those. Bennek was sentenced to 5 years for possession in 2001, and spent his time at Blackgate Penitentiary quietly. He realized, sitting in the cold, dark cell with maniacs all around him, that he had a choice: he could continue doing every drug he could find and ruin his life, or he could make a change. He was a crafty guy: he was always the first to find a drug connection, he was the guy that could easily make friends at parties, and he knew his ways around the streets. When he was released on good behaviour in 2005, he knew that there was one place where he could use his skills legally and get paid for them: the Narcotics division of Gotham's Crime Department. Without even changing out of his prison clothing, Bennek walked to the Narcotics Department Head's Office, slammed his street clothes on the Head's desk, and said the words that would change his life's course forever: "Hi. My name is Alexi Bennek, and I need a job." 17. Alderman of Bludhaven

- a. "Hey mom?" a young Graham Atherton yelled across the house.

"Yes, dear?"

"It's a bad name, honey, but it's accurate"

Born and raised in Gotham's most violent neighbourhood, Atherton was forced to deal with reality from a young age. As a child, he got into fights on a regular basis, not because he wanted to but because he had to. He learned to stand up for himself, and eventually became known as the "Shark of Bludhaven": if anyone messed with him, he'd be out for blood. He rode on the coattails of his reputation for the next few years of his life – he worked for a few years in construction, and then decided that the only way to fix his hometown was through politics and started campaigning to be the Alderman of Bludhaven. At first, it was a close race – he and his opponent Goingto Losethisrace were neck and neck, and it was anybody's call. Then, three days before election day, Losethisrace disappeared out of the blue. By default, Atherton was named the victor, and remains the Alderman of Bludhaven today, overseeing the neighborhood's developments and departments. To this day, no one knows what happened to Goingto Losethisrace. His body was never found.

18. Judge on Gotham Supreme Court
